Here are a few ideas that Unity ministries have shared with us:

- Plan your event 24 12 months in advance if possible.
- Have your leadership create videos about your celebration to get the energy up!
- Hold a special book study, concert, class, workshop, that goes with your theme
- o Hold a celebration gala or other event
- Tie a special fundraiser in with one or more of your events
- Tie in your celebration with the launch of a new vision or special project
- Lead an inter-generational event, choir, etc.
- Lead a multi-month event with several options, or keep it super simple with one event
- Ask special guest speakers to lead one or more Sunday services
- o Invite former ministers, LUTs. Speakers, presenters to any or all of the above
- Invite former congregants, and donors to bring them back into the mission/vision of the ministry
- o Invite your local community
- o Write articles or social media posts about your event
- Show a PowerPoint presentation of your past highlights. It can be set to music to have a "video" like feel to it
- Be a guest on the radio, news, or podcast to share the excitement and get PR
- Pick a theme that aligns with Unity principles
- Recruit diverse ambassadors (board members, teens, other volunteers) to help you promote
- Do a joint fundraiser with a cause that is near and dear to your leadership and/or congregation
